We have read three stories during reading workshop over the past three weeks. Each story is written at three different levels, each matched to students' reading comprehension and oral reading fluency. The leveled books are accompanied by differentiated activities and assessments, as well. This assures that each child is challenged to achieve at his or her personalized reading level.

We have been working through the writing process as we have written several personal narratives.

Students write every day. All students are provided with clear grade-level

expectations as well as the expectations for one grade higher. This enables students to consistently strive for higher achievement while receiving the support they need to meet the expectations for this year.

We also work on grammar skills every day. Students work on a grammar sheet in the morning, which we review each afternoon. We utilize multiple resources to connect

grammar to our reading and writing. Grammar is more than rules in room five. Here, it is a resource for understanding what we read and write every day.

Students continue to work on spelling. We do not get to practice every day, which is why homework is SO important. The words students sort are also differentiated according to their readiness. Students are working at a variety of levels spanning three years worth of words.
